
There are several committees (unofficial) that are working on preparations for Camp Petaluma.



This is your invitation to join your fellow East Bay Area 510/925 Military Vehicle Collectors in the parade and to transport Veterans and/or Cub and Boy Scouts in one of the best Veterans Day Parades in Northern California. Troop transport trucks are especially welcome.

If you are interested in joining a convoy to Pleasanton, please note the following March Order.

March Order for Military Vehicle Convoy on Sunday, 5 November 2017

Operation/Mission: Convoy to Pleasanton, CA to transport Veterans and/or Cub and Boy Scouts in the annual Tri-Valley Veterans Day Parade. Military vehicles are welcome to join the convoy at a rendezvous location.

Situation: Convoy speed 35 MPH. Arrive at the parade staging area about 1200 hours. Parade steps off at 1300 hours and lasts about one hour. Convoy moves rain or shine.

March Route: No freeway travel. The convoy route follows city streets and back roads. i.e. From Danville, Stone Valley Rd, Green Valley Rd, Diablo Rd, Blackhawk Rd, Camino Tassajara, Santa Rita Rd, Main St, to Pleasanton.

Communications: Those with military radios can maintain contact on 51.00 MHz

I'm going to start off with a little history.... I joined MVCC along with my longtime friend Rick Butler back in 1992; when we started the LRDG truck project. So Rick & I have been a member for 25 years, not as long as some of you but longer than some others. For those that didn't know; Rick has always been a "Ford" man and I had to talk him into this "Chevy Project". I had by that time accumulated quite a bit of British kit but needed a truck to put it on. After Rick agreed to the project we set about looking for a good "donor" truck.

I found the "first' one in an auction yard in Paso Robles on the weekend of the "Rodney King" riots (but that's another story). But we learned that the wheel base was longer than specified in my research and continued looking. Rick found some old farm trucks in his area that had the proper wheel base and started work, using photos that I purchased from the Imperial War Museum.

Even though it was not running; we took it to a number of events in 1993, 94 & 95, to give it as much exposure as possible. Most notably "The Soldier of Fortune Show" in Las Vegas in 1994; "The Great Western Gun Shows", Woodson Bridge and Big Bear.

In October of 1995; Rick had installed an engine and we "field tested" it at the 1st Winnemucca, Nevada event. I actually drove it under Rick's careful tutelage. That following August 1996, we took it to our first judged MVPA Convention in Portland, where I registered it in the proper 1 ½ Motor pool ready class. Looking back I cannot tell you how nervous I was, to have someone "pick apart" what Rick and I had so carefully researched and assembled. Not to worry as we took 1st place in our class. When I asked Kenton Tucker about judging he was a perfect gentleman and explained how it was done.

In the intervening years Rick gradually improved the truck mechanically and I added to the appropriate British kit. We have displayed the truck as far North as Tacoma, Washington, South as Los Angeles and has far East as Las Vegas and Reno (actually Winnemucca is further east).

We have done Air Shows, Truck Shows (ATHS), car shows and an unbelievable number of parades (including San Francisco). I have enjoyed every minute of it, and have a wall of awards to show for it.

In 2004 I added an LRDG jeep to the collection (as Donna wasn't keen on riding in the truck). That opened up other local events that I could attend without having Rick bring the truck down from Yreka; and to continue touting the adventured of the LRDG during WW II. Shortly thereafter Rick started on our second truck (T-9) which was to be the Radio Truck. It was to be ready for 2008 MVPA Convention (again in Portland). Not making excuses but that didn't happen. Again it was to be ready for the 2013 MVPA Convention (again in Portland), which didn't happen, we still had a wonderful display with T-8, my jeep, John Neuenburg's S.A.S. jeep and Kevan Bowan's P.P.A. jeep.

It was becoming difficult for Rick to continue bringing the truck to MVCC events and I had neither the expertise nor equipment to haul it around; I was just able to handle the jeep and trailer rig. Rick actually drove the truck to Lodi on several occasions when his tow vehicle was non- op. And it didn't look like the second truck would ever get finished.

So in November of 2015, I convinced Rick that the trucks would be better off finding a new home, and Eagle Field Foundation was the place. Doug Boales has plenty of room and a bevy of volunteers to help with the maintenance etc. He has done an excellent job taking it to several venues that we hadn't considered. He managed to get both trucks to the MVPA Convention at the Alameda County Fair Grounds, has had them both painted and done much needed maintenance on T-8.

So as soon as it can be arraigned, donation and transfer of ownership will be conveyed to the Eagle Field Foundation. I will still continue bringing the jeep as long as I am able, but will soon be celebrating 79 years on this earth, and have greatly enjoyed the last 25 years as a member of the MVCC.


