Hello Everyone: First off, Happy New Year to one and all. I hope 2018 will be a great year for all.

If you have not have sent in your dues, take a minute to do so and continue to receive the newsletter. I hope everyone had a safe and happy holiday and got some great goodies to add to your OD projects. Looks like the rain is here, as its been raining for a couple days now.

I met John Neuenburg at Camp Petaluma this past Tuesday, and we had a meeting with the park owner, Woody. The main focus of the talk were the things members brought up in the General Membership meeting last April. The fee at the gate for day visitors, shuttles, parking, and non-camper foot traffic. I think the biggest hassle was for those there for the day to pick up parts, shop and visit friends. Most of these visitors were not camping with a site reserved. If you have a camp site and you invite friends, you need to create wrist bands for them when you check in. Many of the sites, excluding the \$10 a head per night group tent area, get 4 wrist bands to give to guests. Your guests need to check in at the front desk to get those bands. We are working out a way for the MVCC to possibly buy wrist bands for Day-Use to sell at \$5 each. This is not set in stone, but is a work in progress. We are also looking for a cheap shuttle and better offsite parking solutions. Bottom line, the best way to attend this swapmeet is to camp at the KOA. With that said, there are still some opportunities for tent camping in the group area, several small cabins and even a couple lodges available. The small cabins are a very reasonable alternative to setting up a tent. FYI: After February 1, campsites without deposits will be available to members and non-members. Please call KOA at 707-763-1492 and put a deposit on your site. Please confirm your arrival date. There are some sites in jeopardy that had campers in them last year. If you are unsure of the status of your campsite, please call ASAP.



The last four or five months have been rather a personal trial for me. It started back in August when I didn't feel right and had some difficulty breathing (actually I have been felling like crap since then). Went to the Doctors and they adjusted some of my medication, then back to the office in September as the changes didn't seem to be working.

So they thought a series of test might discover what was going on. First in October an "Echocardiogram" which showed that my heart was not working quite as it should. I could have told them that....

Then in the beginning of November; they subjected me to a "Chemical Stress Test" which was interesting and didn't show any improvement in heart function. The most recent test at the end of November was an Angiogram (looking for some blockage in the heart veins). So the consensus of opinion of those that "Practice Medicine" is that at this point I will need a "Pacemaker" and a "Defibrillator". So at this point "All I want for Christmas is a Pacemaker". Just waiting patiently for them to call with a schedule for the procedure. Hoping that 2018 will be a better as far as my health is concerned. (update Jack had the procedure and is doing well.) Ed. Wow, the big Spring meet is less than four months away! Time flies! It's the last week of April this time. What a scenic campground Petaluma KOA is, and a beautiful part of the country for MV driving. Dave, Jo-Ann, and others are working hard to make our second event at Petaluma KOA another great one. As Dave said last month, being in a campsite or cabin solves the issue about offsite parking and shuttles for day visitors. We think some who commuted from home or hotel last year will camp, maybe sharing with a friend. The inexpensive Group Camp Area with no fournight minimum is an option, as is splitting a long pull-through numbered site. Ask Jo-Ann about that.

For you day visitors, if April is dry we might have permission to park on the long field below the entrance road. But assume offsite parking and shuttle buses. If we can find volunteers with trucks, we will have a parts delivery service for folks moving items to and from that lot. MV owners in the area please note that all MVs will be allowed to drive into the campground. More on this later.

Campers may again store cars and trailers in KOAs commercial RV storage lot at the north end. We can block the tenant trailers and RVs because the KOA owner is prohibiting them from accessing their vehicles during our week. This is a great way to free up space at your campsite for vendor tables and MVs. Speaking of vendors, there seemed to be a lot of interesting merchandise for sale last year and some new sellers. This venue is in a large MV collector market and there were many new people attending who don't normally journey to Tower Park. The word about this meet is getting out. Could it be some older collectors are starting to clear out their parts and militaria? Any camper may put out sale items at no charge. There is no vending allowed outside of paid campsites. A seller wanting a hot location might consider working with a cabin or campsite renter to use his/her unused space. Share the rent! This can work for a seller who is commuting from home or hotel. Talk to Jo-Ann if you are interested in sharing a campsite.

We are bringing back a big **MILITARY DODGE SHOWCASE**, being organized primarily by Johnny Verissimo and Dave Ball. I hear there are a LOT of half tons signed up! Will it be the largest assembly of ex-military Dodges in the U.S.? All years, models, and conditions are wanted for this display and magazine article photo shoot. More details elsewhere, and please let one of these men know if your truck will be there so they can plan enough space.

Also being featured for the first time in decades is a **MILITARY MOTORCYCLE**, **SCOOTER**, and **BICY-CLE SHOWCASE**. We anticipate quite a lot of variety. Let's do this twice - Thursday afternoon and Saturday for three hours each. The owner does not have to be present at our Showcases. In fact if anybody wants to drop off a bike early and leave, it can be stored next to my cabin and I will watch it and move it into the display. Showcase will be in front of the Rec Hall, or at the bottom of that street at my little cabin #81. Whatever runs will be paraded around the campground after the display. Parents hide your children!!! If you want to bring something please contact me. I am the POC.

Greg Lalonde is leading the **Point Reyes MV Excursion** Friday morning. The plan is to visit the historic RCA/Marconi Wireless Station, which was a powerful ship-to-shore and land station known as KPH. A very scenic driving loop is planned which includes a possible beach visit and lunch opportunity in Inverness. Bring your camera to catch the great vistas. Time to get "Old Betsy" tuned, lubricated, registered, and insured!

Please bring your MV! It may be that MVs driving in will not need a parking pass, just have the gate code and your wristband in your pocket if asked for it. If you don't have a campsite for parking and displaying it, we will find room. There are some common areas we can use, some depending on firm turf. I will be the coordinator for those. If you are a camper with extra room for a MV on your parking pad, please let Jo-Ann or me know. We saw a LOT of underutilized campsites last year. Please work with us to make this the best MV gathering and swap meet possible. Same goes for folks needing parking space. We prefer you don't show up at the gate saying, "where is my spot?" Unless directed otherwise, there is no parking in the campground outside of campsites, and no parallel parking along the roads which are fire lanes, and trailer rigs may need the space. Not much different than Tower Park. Respect traffic cones and signs please!

A **Ladies Excursion** is being planned. Hopefully a POC will be identified by the time you read this. Look for news about this and other fun stuff next month!

CAMP PETALUMA

The 41th Annual West Coast Military Vehicle Rally & Swap Meet April 24-29, 2018 (Second One at Petaluma Which Replaced the Tower Park Venue)

San Francisco/Petaluma KOA 20 Rainsville Road Petaluma, CA 94952

BASIC TRAINING

This is the fourth venue for the largest annual MV swap meet and MV gathering west of the Mississippi. It will be at a large campground in Sonoma County, one of KOA's most popular. As mentioned last year, we moved the April meet from Tower Park Resort because of space problems. The new owner is creating more RV pull-through sites by combining back-in sites, has added many cabins, and a large water slide is planned. But we had a successful Fall meet there last September and that will return September 18-23, 2018.

Here are highlights of the Spring 2018 event and venue:

Official event is Tuesday – Sunday like last year the discounted group rates will be good for "early birds" arriving there the prior Sunday. Last Sunday is pull out day, not a show day No MV registration required

No fee for those selling at their campsites. There is no other vendor area

Day use visitors including those with MVs are welcome. Important details below

You are welcome to drive MVs in the campground unless tracks damage roads

Hotels, restaurants, antique stores and more are a short drive away

A majority of the numbered sites and cabins have been reserved as of October 2017. Although check with Jo Ann after Feb 1st for unclaimed sites. There will be a dry camping Group Area for a low daily fee. This is also a way to get parking inside the facility.

As in the past, our own Jo-Ann Lesser is our "Wagon mistress" and will assign all campsites and cabins. Only then will KOA accept your deposit. Contact her with your request via Jo Ann's info below

Four-night minimum stay, any four nights, except in the Group Area

Shared outdoor, roofed kitchen in the north area

Recreation hall and tent

Pool, sauna, hot tub, dog park, wi-fi, fire rings & firewood

Washers, dryers, restrooms with showers

Trailer, overflow parking for campers and cabin renters in the RV storage yard Scenic beauty abounds here, and there is no more chance of rain than at Lodi

CAMPING (details subject to change – check back here)

KOA has a wide variety of cabins, RV and tent campsites, and dry camping options. There is a four-night minimum stay – any four nights, which was our concession to get the best discounted rates. Exception is the group dry camp area which might again be \$10/night per person.

Campers and cabin renters in numbered sites will receive four wristbands, which can be kept in your pocket and shown upon request of campground security, and vehicle passes. KOA rules say two vehicles per campsite and more may be allowed. We are negotiating that. Campers must leave guest wristbands at the office on "will call" for friends/family.

Each Group Area camper will pay a \$10 fee per person per day for one event wristband, a tent or other camping unit, and one vehicle. Note the PARKING info below and how the Group Area might be your best option.

If you have been assigned a cabin or campsite by Jo-Ann, you MUST contact KOA to put a deposit on it ASAP or risk losing it, just like at Tower Park! Sites with no deposit will be offered to someone on the wait list at any time

If you have a site reserved and are not going to use it but want to keep the reservation for that site for the following year, tell Jo-Ann

Let her know if you want to share a site. Many of the sites are 50'+ pull-throughs, so there is vehicle access on two sides. KOA has a discounted half site rate for sharing a site and should be able to place a second picnic table with some notice

DAY VISITORS

As of this writing, October 10, 2017, we know there will be a day-user fee but not what that will be. Last April it was \$10. Nice campgrounds with pool, sauna, recreational facilities often charge a fee for non-campers

Like at Tower Park, there is no visitor parking lot inside the campground. Consider renting space in the Group Area and parking there. Visitors driving MVs see information below. We want you to bring it!

See next section about general parking

IMPORTANT PARKING INFO!

CAMPERS AND CABIN RENTERS: Most campsites and cabins have paved or gravel vehicle parking pads. Nearly all big cabins only have ONE parking space, so you might have to stash an extra vehicle in the trailer storage yard. See next item. DO NOT park on lawns so that KOA will have to repair it. This may cost you money. If lawns are firm this rule could loosen for light MVs. Like Tower Park do not parallel park on the roads which will obstruct fire trucks and large trailer rigs. A camper will receive a pass for one vehicle and trailer. We have negotiating being able to park more vehicles on each pad if there are military vehicles.

TRAILER & EXTRA VEHICLE PARKING LOT: There is a RV storage lot at the north end next to the Group Camping Area. We have permission to block permanent trailers in there – the owners are not allowed access during our event. This is for campers, not visitors. Please park non-MV trailers there, plus your pickup or car if necessary. Even if you have space in your campsite, freeing up room can allow your buddy to park his extra MV there. Work out a deal!

GENERAL VISITOR PARKING AND HEAVY TRAILER UNLOADING, PARKING: We

hope to have the long, narrow field next to the KOA entrance road for our parking, but this is weather-dependent. We will again have an off-site parking lot, possibly closer than the lot we used last time across from Pete's Henny Penny Restaurant at Stony Point Road and Petaluma Blvd North. Check back here for details including shuttle details as this is still in the works. Offload large MVs off-site and drive them in if possible. A big rig should not be driven in via the KOA entrance road unless you have arranged to enter the campground gate AND know you can turn it around in there. The entrance road does not have room for that.

TRACKED VEHICLES: Do not drive around the campground with worn tracks or steel grousers that will scrape the pavement. We may have a static display spot for you with prior arrangements

CAMPERS WITH MILITARY VEHICLES: Bring it! We should have room for all MVs however they should park at campsites unless a space has been assigned by MVCC President Dave Ball or Activities Coordinator John Neuenburg. See contact info below. Respect all coned or other reserved areas! You may have to park your civilian vehicle in the trailer storage yard, in a buddy's campsite, or the offsite lot to make room for your MVs.

NON-CAMPERS WITH MILITARY VEHICLES: Bring it! Please work with a friend who has space at his campsite or ask us for a spot, ideally before the meet. We will publish a map showing who is renting sites. Ask a MVCC officer if you want contact information. Again, consider renting a dry campsite in the Group Area so you can park your vehicle (and ice chest) when not driving around camp. This area does not have the four-night minimum. Contact

Jo-Ann Lesser about this.

IF YOU HAVE EXTRA VEHICLE SPACE IN YOUR CAMPSITE: Please tell John Neuenburg and he will try to put you together with someone who needs room for a MV!

ACTIVITIES

Activities will be published closer to the event. There will be at least one offsite driving event. Sonoma County and West Marin County offer scenic MV road driving.

We are trying to get more food trucks for the Afternoons and Friday dinner, when there will be music either MVCC funded DJ or live band depending on if we can find a sponsor for the live band!!!, and probably at least one pancake breakfast organized by the "Spark Plugs" ladies group


