If you are a returning participant and know your site number please fill it in. If you are new leave the assigned site square blank and I will assign you a site. Please remember to fill in the length of your rig so that I can assign the appropriate site, I will then contact you via email. At this time there are no cabins available. If you do not have an RV and want to tent or car camp you will be at the Amador County Fairgrounds right next door to the RV Resort. Please fill out the Fairgrounds portion of the form. If you know your site number please fill it in. If you are new to this event leave the site number block blank and I will assign you a site. At this time there are no water/electric site open.

**Important information -**Registration forms will be accepted any time after publication in the NEWS. Non members will need to go to www.mvccnews.net after January 1, 2023 to get the form.

RV site deposits must be made to the 49'er RV Resort prior to March 16, 2023. At that time the 49'er takes back any sites without deposits. Folks staying at the Fairgrounds must include payment with their registration form and should reach me no later than April 01, 2023

As we move into Spring and begin preparations for the Plymouth meet I'd like to talk a little bit about how the MVCC handles the fees for the meet. I know this has been covered many times but there still some confusion about it. The MVCC only collects the fees for people who stay over at the Amador County Fairgrounds and these are used to cover our costs of renting the areas we utilize along with the porta-pottis and the hand wash stations. Anything over those costs returns to the MVCC treasury. Over at the 49er RV Park we manage the space reservations so that you get the ones you want that meet your needs. We do not collect any of the fees for those sites, that's all done by the RV Park itself. When you send checks to the MVCC there's no process for us to deposit them and then pay the 49er. For those of you that stay there please remember to pay them directly. The other issue that keeps coming up is that people contact the 49er directly to ask for spaces and are told that nothing is available for that week. It's not that spaces aren't available, the Park blocks a certain number of spaces for the MVCC and when you call them directly their only option is to tell you that nothing is available because they're already blocked for us. They rely on us to let them know who our members are and the space(s) they're in so that when they arrange payment they will receive the MVCC discounted rate. I know this makes it a little more complicated for non-members but for first timers so it's important to let them know how we handle this and for returning non-members that should know better all I can say is join up! We want you to be a part of the MVCC and as a member you'll receive all the notifications of events and changes beforehand. We are one of the lowest cost clubs around and really would like you to become part of the fold.

I've just received the Morgan Hill July 4<sup>th</sup> parade application and will handle it right away so we'll be registered. When our parade location is returned to us I'll get it into the newsletter and ask Sean to get it up on the website. I'd like to hear from any of the South Bay members interested in doing something either at Mount Madonna, Uvas Reservoir, Hollister Hills or Casa de Fruita. Please let me know if a campout is something you'd like to do and if you have a preference.



Howdy MVer's,

Camp Plymouth is approaching quickly so we all need to get cracking on preventative maintenance of our MVs. As I mentioned last month, I've been working on getting the 1941 Indian 741B ready for the showcase. I was having issues with it not wanting to start. I put a new battery in it but still no go. I took the fuel filter out and found it was gunked up. Don't you just love the crappy gas we have to use these days? I even mix Sea Foam and other fuel stabilizers in my fuel to keep the fuel from going bad. The fuel filter is an interesting design. It consists of a stack of thin, fine, brass, washers that have a little bit of play so that it catches debris and other things from getting into the carburetor. Cleaned it up and she fired up immediately. It running a bit rough so I'll tackle that and update next month.

I also started sanding and prepping the 1965 Cushman Lobster for paint. The rear fender needed a bit of work to get some dents and dings out and the rear tail light bracket was bent up pretty badly as well. I got them off and worked the sheet metal to get it in pretty good shape. I sand blasted the tail light bracket and primed that and the tail light and the rear fender. I'll tackle the bed and engine cover later this month and hopefully will have it done and painted before Camp Plymouth.

As always, please share with me any events, projects etc. so I can post them in our newsletter. Looking forward to a great April event.

Hello out there in MV land!

We're finally drying out a bit and the weather is warming up! At the Shop we're up to our eyeballs in Dodge parts. As you may recall the kids and I were able to get the engine from Peter's BBQ'ed M37 up and running, then we promptly pulled it out and cracked it open for inspection. We were hopeful that the guts would look OK and we'd be able to clean it up and use it to replace the wounded engine in my truck. We were hopeful...

Unfortunately, the engine needs to be rebuilt, but the autopsy has been fun. Here's what we've found so far:

- The rod bearings are pretty tired from a combination of debris and corrosion. The crank needs to be turned. It's already .010" under.
- The cylinders are standard bore. They are VERY heavily worn on the non-thrust surfaces while thrust surfaces looked OK, just glazed. There was no ridge at the top of the cylinders. I'm thinking it may have overheated at some point???? The location of the heavy wear is weird.
- The pistons looked good, unlike the bores?!
- It took 4 class periods to remove the intake and exhaust manifold pair. If you've never dealt with a flathead Dodge this can be a real treat. A combination of heat, penetrating lube, an overhead crane, an array of pry bars and a ton of patience did the trick. There was a cheer when the pair finally came off! Now we just have to remove one broken stud. It seems Cameron didn't think a ½" breaker bar was too much for that poor unlubricated 3/8" nut/stud combo that had been together for so many decades! SNAP!!!! Live and learn.
- We're going to verify some deck height measurements and tear down the remainder of the engine this coming week. Hopefully we won't find any new surprises!

Our plan for the rebuild is based on an evolution of the previous motor we built. It worked well compared to the stock specification, but I think it can be improved with careful measuring and a bit of machine work. Our max cruise RPM is 3000, so there's nothing terribly fancy going on, just little details. We plan on using the small chamber Plymouth head from the last motor, but we're going to up the compression ratio further and improve the squish. This is a trick with these motors. With stock pistons, deck height and gasket you're looking at around .100" clearance from the piston to the head. If you're using the typical aftermarket pistons you're at .120". We want to reduce this to .040". It's just a question of how to get there. I'm looking at having a custom head gasket made and milling the deck of the block. We're shooting for a final static CR of 8.5:1. If past experience proves correct we should pick up both torque and economy with no downside. Now I just need to convince the machine shop to deal with decking the block. Setting up for a 23" long six when they are typically doing V8's is a pain! At least they didn't give me a flat out "NO!" when I discussed the job with them. We did finish rebuilding the LU4 winch from Peter's truck and both the transmission and PTO look good. When things start going back together it looks like my M37 will gain a new and improved engine and a winch. Of course there's a bit to do before that happens!!!

#### 2023 ARIZONA MVCC SHOW By Phil Kern

MVCC members from both NorCal and SoCal migrated to the Land of the Free to enjoy the Arizona MVCC's 32<sup>nd</sup> Annual Military

Vehicle Show in Phoenix on January 27th-28th. Held at the historic Heard Scout Pueblo backed up against South Mountain, it provided a unique venue to display over 30 restored military vehicles, a few survivors along with a few pretenders. Militaria vendors also turned out in force, something in the range of 40-50 tables were loaded with green stuff of every type. AZ MVCCers said this year's show had to be organized on the fly as their air show partners from last year were unable to come through, but most attendees did not think it reflected on the production. Along with the site, one thing somewhat unique about the AZ show is that any MV, or vehicle resembling an MV, is generally welcome. One example I stared at for a while vaguely resembled the XM443 Super Mule; however, a tongue-incheek informational board claimed it was a "prototype XM212" that was not selected for military production as it was two-wheel drive. Having written articles on military vehicles for over 25 years I consider myself somewhat knowledgeable on the subject but was not familiar with this particular machine. Eventually the light bulb went on and I figured out 212 was the model number for a VW Bus, the cut-down remains of which formed the foundation of the "XM 212" vehicle.

Although no awards dinner was held this year due to the abbreviated planning schedule, the Best of Show award went to a recently completed rare and highly modified Dodge M152 Utility Truck. Powered by an Isuzu diesel engine turning a five-speed overdrive transmission and five ton axles, the M152 was easily capable of highway speeds, featured disk brakes on all four corners, handled well and the enclosed cabin provided plenty of room for overlanding or overnight trips, including auxiliary power. Another unique element of the AZ shows has been the ability to display actual real accoutrements along with your vehicle. You can assume that a fully accessorized HMMWV that is roped off is roped off for good reason, not just to keep kids from climbing on it. One vehicle that both adults and kids were allowed to climb on was Russ Morgan's M18 Hellcat Tank Destroy-





er. Russ was chomping a cigar while firing up the 9-cylinder radial engine of the Hellcat, fumes from both wafted across the parking lot as he gave rides around the site to several lucky folks after the show closed for the day. I also bumped into Mama Lesser, Wagonmistress for the Plymouth meet, at the show, confirmed my reservations and offered to corral her wayward husband for her, her response to me was "don't bother". Hope to see everybody at Plymouth in April, including those from the Free States... Phil...

#### Poker Rally at Camp Plymouth by Nancy Porter

As we work on finishing our projects for the big upcoming Camp Plymouth, I wanted to encourage you to participate in our highly popular Poker Rally. There are so many activities scheduled for Thursday and Friday, so the **Poker Rally will be held after the general meeting on Saturday**. We always get questions about how it works and whether you need to already know the area or need to know how to play poker.

#### **Guide to the MVCC Poker Rally**

- 1. This is a way to have a chance to drive our vehicles and explore the area. No need to already be familiar with Amador County since each year we have a slightly different route.
- 2. Best to have someone to read the instructions (aka Navigator) in addition to the driver.
- 3. Vehicles must be insured and road-ready.
- 4. This is NOT a race. Goal is to watch for ribbons designating a poker stop and to collect a hand of 7 sealed envelopes of poker cards by the time you get to the final stop.
- 5. You don't need to know how to play poker. You will be drawing a random set of sealed cards and we'll have people at the end that can tell whether the cards you drew compose a winning hand.
- 6. Have an opportunity to win cash prizes for 1st, 2nd and 3rd place.

Vehicles will gather at 12:30 pm at Wolin Arena at the Fairgrounds. Fill out the registration form then, receive a set of driving instructions and pay the coordinator \$5 per poker hand (maximum of 2 hands per person). Driver's meeting shortly before 1 pm. First vehicle out at 1 pm, with vehicles out in 2-5 minute intervals.

Navigator will read off each instruction telling you where to turn as you drive past (and into) winery properties, past green fields and livestock, and into other locations. Along the drive, everyone in your vehicle will be looking for a set of streaming red, white and blue ribbons. Each time you see the streamers, pull off the road and have someone get out to look for a nearby can and pick up your cards. Then, get back in your vehicle and continue following the route instructions.

Poker cards are sealed in envelopes and piled into big cans that are set out at each stop. At the first stop, each envelope will be labeled with an "A" for Alpha. Cards at the next stop will be labeled with "B" for Bravo, and so on through 7 cans of labeled envelopes. If your vehicle has paid for 4 hands of cards (such as 2 hands for the driver and 2 hands for the navigator), you would take 4 card envelopes out of each can.

DO NOT OPEN THE ENVELOPES!! When you get to the end location, there will be a team to open the envelopes and record your cards. Any open envelopes will be disqualified.

The money that's collected before the rally will be distributed as follows:

1st Place: 50% of the pot 2nd Place: 30% of the pot 3rd Place: 20% of the pot

In addition, we will have a bonus can ("H" for Hotel) at the recording station at the end of the route. Each ace that's drawn out of Can H will have the \$5 fee returned to that person.

#### Arizona Military Vehicle Collectors Club Meet by Joe Snodgrass

This year marked the 32<sup>nd</sup> Annual Arizona Military Vehicle Show hosted by the AMVCC, and we pulled it together in just 52 days from deciding on and signing for the venue. In that short time we sold all 41 "Swap Meet" spaces (5 RV dry camping spots and 18 each 16'x16' & 12'x12' spaces) PLUS added space for our sister club from Tucson (the SAMVCC) and the Boy Scouts. We had over 85 military vehicles, trailers & motorcycles displayed against the stunning backdrop of South Mountain, overlooking the Valley of the Sun. Some highlights included Dan Dolan's M18 "Hellcat" Tank Destroyer, Rod Shaver's T16 Universal Carrier, 37mm Anti -Tank Gun and Turret Gun display. Dan Parmley brought out most? of his incredible collection including his M113(?) tracked personnel carrier, recon motorcycles and diverse M151 series collection. Dale Campbell displayed both of his pristine WLA WWII motorcycles as well. The swap meet areas offered military surplus goods, militaria, vehicle parts, collectibles... even MREs!

Feedback from vendors and club members was overwhelmingly positive and the show was successful (financially, aesthetically, weather-wise). Unfortunately general public attendance was just over 600, due to late announcement of the venue, lack of advertising and very limited parking. The Heard Scout Pueblo camp actually has 500 acres with much more camping and display area than we utilized, but with so little parking for the general public to come to the show, it's hard to imagine how to hold the show at this beautiful site again.

Advertising was almost exclusively social media, emails and word of mouth. Signs on the nearest major road (Baseline) drew in a significant percentage as well, but the camp was not visible from any of the major freeways. Looking ahead, we're already scouting for next year's venue and even elected a Show Director (...since it's clear our current President (moi) took several months too long in selecting a site). Our dream location would be just off a major freeway, with room to spread out. Ideally the Arizona Military Vehicle Collectors Club can find a "forever home" so everyone will know where and when to find us each year, and our friends from California and other states have plenty of time to plan their travel and join us.




We've been working hard to get the word out about this year's Showcase, so that we can get as many military Dodges
